Participation / Age:	Age Category: boys and girls age 15 & 16 (born 1995 – 1996) Girls and boys from all EJU / IJF affiliated countries. In order for an athlete to obtain points for the EJU Ranking List, his / her weight category should have participants from at least 2 different countries. If this is not the case, the competition can still be held, according to the organizer's decision. If, by the nominal deadline, there is only one country inscribed in any weight category, the organizer will inform immediately the NF concerned. Participation per foreign country per weight category is limited up to 4 athletes. Passports will be required at the weigh-in.	
Weight categories & duration:	Girls: -40 kg, -44 kg, -48 kg, -52 kg, -57 kg, -63 kg, -70 kg, +70 kg. Boys: -50 kg, -55 kg, -60 kg, -66 kg, -73 kg, -81 kg, -90 kg, +90 kg. Time of contests: 4 minutes Golden Score: 2 minutes	
Draw	No Seeding. (Only separation by nations). The draw will take place on Friday at 21:00 in Hotel Magura. Draw shall be public with officials of all teams invited and competition sheets distributed right after the draw. Each delegation must be represented at the draw, maximum two officials. EJU / IJF Dress Code: jacket suit with tie.

	<p>Monday, May 23 Departure of the participants to Szczyrk training camp (30 minutes).</p> <p>Monday, 23 May – Wednesday, 25 May Training camp for Cadets will be held in Szczyrk from May 23 to May 25 / no registration fee! Entries by number should be made together with the final entries. Accommodation and meals are to be borne by the participating federations! See the information below.</p>
Competition mode:	<p>Competition will be carried out according to the rules and sporting codes of the EJU: double repechage competition system (6 and more entries); 2 entries: better of 2 fights, if 1-1 third match will decide; 3,4,5 entries: one pool competition system (round robin). In order for an athlete to obtain points for the EJU Ranking List, his / her weight category should have participants from at least 2 different countries. Preliminaries – 4 mats (8 m x 8 m), Bronze medals fights – 2 mats (8 m x 8 m), Finals – 1 mat (8 m x 8 m)</p>
Weigh-in:	<p>Athletes are not allowed to weigh-in naked. Boys must wear at least underwear and girls at least underwear and a T-shirt. Additional 100g will be allowed for their weight category limits. Athletes must present their passport at the official weigh-in.</p>
Refereeing: Special Rules for Cadets	<p>Application of kansetsu waza is prohibited: The referee will stop the action if any of the athletes try to apply kansetsu waza and there will be no penalty. If tori applies kansetsu waza a second time, he is given direct hansoku make and he is not allowed to continue the competition. Application of shime waza is allowed: An athlete who has lost consciousness due to shime waza is not allowed to continue the competition.</p>
Referee:	<p>All participating National Federations are kindly requested to bring at least one international referee to secure neutral refereeing: IJF/ Continental license referee.</p>
Referee meeting:	<p>Saturday 21st May 2011 9:00 New Sport Hall</p>
Judogi & Backnumbers	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Each competitor taking part in the EJU events is obliged to have on the back of his Judogi the official 2011 EJU / IJF back number. The 2010 EJU / IJF back number will only be accepted in European Cups until 31st December 2011. The participating athlete / federation is responsible for ordering and sewing of the back number, which must be the official EJU / IJF one. It should be ordered from www.mybacknumber.com. Production and delivery takes around 4 weeks. The SPONSOR part (if needed) will be given to the head of delegation during registration, and the athletes can stick it themselves using the special glue on the back number. In case the participating federation sends fewer athletes than registered in the numerical entry, the federation will be charged the cost of the back number of all cancelled athletes. <p>The white and blue judogi are obligatory. Judogi control according to the Sokuteiki Rule. All Judoka must compete in IJF Approved Judogi. Hotel reservation before 2nd May 2011 4. Final entry & travel plan before 2nd May 2011 5. Payments before 2nd May 2010 Form delivered to the Polish Judo Association. All hotel reservation must be done only via Polish Judo Association and staying expenses paid to the Polish Judo Association bank account.				
Transfer:	Participating National Federations are responsible to cover their own travel expenses to Bielsko Biala. Krakow - airport / Katowice - airport or Bielsko-Biala railway station to hotels in Bielsko Biala - and back are free of charge for those who pay stay expenses. No transfers from Warsaw.
